Providing Beneficial Habitat for Honey Bees and other Pollinators



Through the Honey Bee Pollinator Effort, NRCS will assist North Dakota agriculture producers with:

- Providing floral forage habitats to benefit hive nutritional health;
- Increasing the available forages that has low or no pesticide exposure;
- Implementing forage plantings and managing for pollinators;
- Reversing the trend of Colony Collapse Disorder by providing healthy landscapes for honey bees.



Eligibility

The program is available to agricultural producers of North Dakota.

The application cutoff date for funding in FY 2014 is **March 21, 2014.**

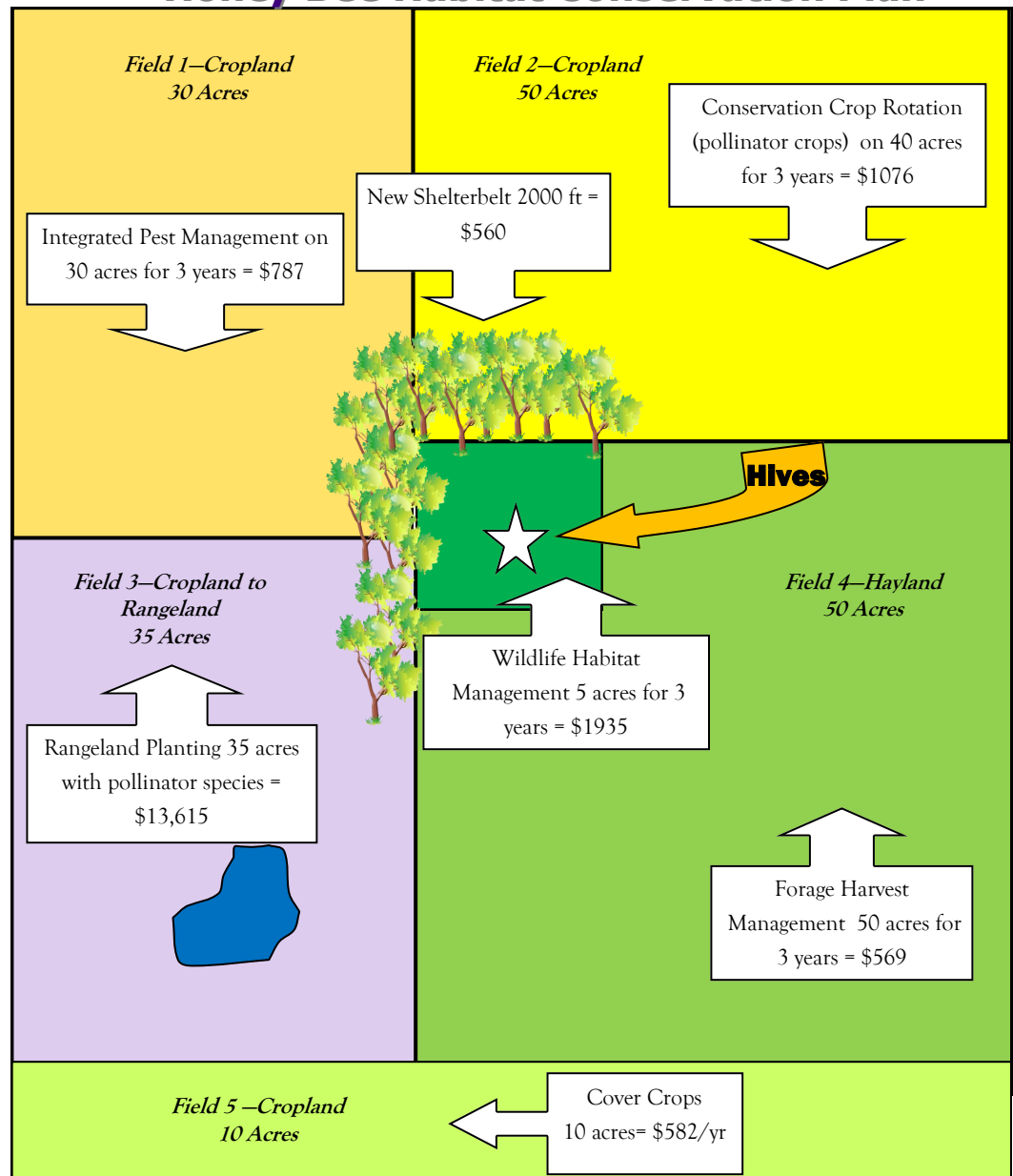
Contact your local NRCS Field Office to research scenarios specific to your farming operation.

The focus of the program is to install core conservation practices such as:

- Conservation Cover, Cover Crops, Conservation Crop Rotation, Field Border, Riparian Herbaceous Cover, Forage Harvest Management, Forage and Biomass Plantings, Range Planting, Prescribed Grazing, Tree / Shrub Establishment, and Early Successional Habitat Development

Additional supporting conservation practices are also available to assist in meeting your conservation goals.
