#### **319 DANZIG DAM & HAILSTONE CREEK WATERSHED**

The Morton County 319 Danzig Dam & Hailstone Creek Watershed Project provides technical, financial and educational assistance to agriculture producers and landowners within the watershed.

The goal of the project is to improve water quality of Danzig Dam, Hailstone Creek and Sims Creek along with their tributaries. This is achieved through the implementation of Best Management Practices (BMPs) by producers and landowners.

Some of the eligible BMP's are: Pasture/Hay land Plantings, Permitted Feedlots, Partial Manure Management, Cover Crops, Water Developments and Cross-Fencing. Through the Morton County 319 Danzig Dam and Hailstone Creek Watershed Project producers and

landowners will be provided 60% in cost-share dollars for BMPs.

Involvement in the program is completely voluntary. There is over \$480,000 in funding available to producers and landowners. Those producers and landowners in the high priority areas of the watershed will be first to receive cost-share assistance.



# Hay Planting and Cover Crops





We are hoping winter is on the mend, and the producers can start looking at firing up their drills for the 2019 planting season.

Many producers have areas they would like to plant into hay land for additional feed and forage for livestock as well as planting cover crops for soil health benefit and additional grazing acres for this fall.

NRCS recommends planting cool-season hay plantings this spring prior to May 10<sup>th</sup>. Most hay plantings will fall in that cool-season grass/legume mix. Warm season grasses should

be seeded from May 10<sup>th</sup> through June 25<sup>th</sup> for optimum growth. If there is a mixture of cool and warm season species, April 20<sup>th</sup> to June 1<sup>st</sup> is the prime time for seeding those species.

For full season cover crop producers, seeding now through June 1<sup>st</sup> is a good time if you are looking for more of the soil health properties, looking to graze cover crops in the fall or hay them later this summer.

NRCS can design a grass mix or cover crop mix for your 2019 planting needs. Please contact the Morton County NRCS office today for your hay, grass or cover crop mix recommendation.

#### Silver Buffaloberry (Shepherdia argentea)

The Silver Buffaloberry (*Shepherdia argentea*), also known as bullberry, is a hardy shrub that grows well in the harsh conditions of North Dakota. Its name comes from the historical use of the berries to accompany bison meat.

The plant has silvery green leaves with thorns around the stem. Buffaloberries produce a bright red fruit that is very attractive to many species of birds and the plant also serves as browse for deer. Occasionally the berries are yellowish-orange. Its thorny branches and suckering growth habit also make it excellent nesting cover. It can tolerate a wide variety of soil types, making it very good for growth in Morton County. The bright red berries are edible, although they are very tart. They can be processed to be used in jams and jellies.



A cultivar of the Silver Buffaloberry, the Sakakawea Buffaloberry, was developed in Bismarck. This cultivar is more tolerant of alkaline and high pH soils, and is great for revegetation of disturbed areas. Roughly 15-20 percent of fruit produced by the Sakakawea cultivar will be yellowish-orange. These plants are great for both wildlife plantings as well as the outside row of a shelterbelt. They will quickly form a thicket, resulting in great cover for wildlife as well as dense growth to catch snow and stop the wind. Either way, if you are thinking about planting a row of shrubs, give the buffaloberry some thought!

# 10' No-Till Grass Drill Available for Rent



Morton County Soil Conservation District has a 10' Truax Grass Drill. This drill is available to rent to the producers of Morton County. Minimum HP tractor—60hp. Overall Width—14' Row Spacing -7.5"

Producer is responsible for clean/vacuum out drill and seed tubes. Clean off excess mud/debris as well as any damage.

The cost is \$10/acre with a \$50 delivery fee, if applicable. If you would like to use the drill and/or get more information, please call the office at 701-667-1163 ext. 3.

### Kuhn Manure Spreader for Rent

The SCD is renting a Kuhn Knight 160 manure spreader with vertical beaters to the producers of Morton County. Unlike horizontal beaters, vertical beaters give a more even spread (25-30 ft.) of livestock manure or compost over a field.

Producers can rent the spreader for \$275/day. Clean-up and maintenance are the responsibility of the renter as well as any damages. The spreader has a capacity of 350+ bushels and a 160 HP tractor is recommended. Both the big and small 1000 rpm PTO shafts are available.
