#### ٧. REPORT OF COOPERATING AGENCIES

The plan is to get all those wanting EQIP into the 1st batching if they don't make it see if they can be transferred to 319 or OMG programs.
  - Office is not opening any time soon. Might end up going back to one person in the office at a time per agency, as COVID numbers are so high.
- b. County Extension Agent Renae Gress Attached is her of upcoming events. Court house is on mask mandate. They have been working from home and office. There will be no Living Ag classroom for the kids they are asking that each presenter submit a video they can forward on. The BSC Ag Marketing was done by Zoom and it had a very good turnout.

Rude suggested sending a letter with them to the IRS explaining what happened and asking for maybe a less of a punishment. There have been ways to make sure this doesn't happen in the future.
