EQIP- Six EQIP contracts have been obligated and we will be getting producer folders out to them. We have started contacting producers on our planning list and will continue to do so through field season. That list is currently at 23 producers.

CRP- There were two CRP offers in the general signup, we will find out soon if they were accepted. The deadline for CRP Grasslands is May 26th, so far we have 15 separate offers. There are some of those that will be looking to plan some water developments in that contract.

I have been keeping up with contracts making sure they are on schedule and have everything they need to complete their planned practices this summer. Three grass seedings went in before the cool season grass seeding deadline of May 10th for active contracts in the county. I have been out to stake a pipeline or two and have heard from several producers that well drillers and contractors are starting to work on some of their projects. Over the next week or so we will be going out to stake any cost shared tree plantings. Four miles of rows have been staked so far.

I have been out to finish up cultural resource walks and re-routes of pipelines that have popped up for various reasons. Janelle Harrison, one of our cultural resources specialists and I went out to take a deeper look at a pipeline route from a 2022 contract that had known sites in the area.

Personnel updates: Jacob Dummer will be acting DC in Selfridge. We will be getting an intern this summer. Their name is Jordan Robinson a student at the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff majoring in Agronomy.

SUBJECT: LTP – LOCALLY LED CONSERVATION (LLC) PROCESS AND LOCAL WORK GROUPS (LWG) ALONG WITH LOCAL WORK GROUPS ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY INCENTIVES PROGRAM (EQIP) RANKING CRITERIA AND PRIORITIZATION OF RESOURCE CONCERN CATEGORIES FOR FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2024

Purpose. To request submission of LWG EQIP ranking criteria and prioritization of resource concern categories.

Expiration Date. September 30, 2023.

Background. This bulletin establishes the criteria for both the Locally Led Conservation (LLC) Process and Local Work Groups (LWG). The bulletin also explains the process to be used by your Local Work Group and Local Work Groups within the new Conservation Delivery Units (CDUs) and Programmatic Zones.

Locally Led Conservation (LLC) is a process used by local people to assess their natural resource conditions and needs. This group is generally made up of a wide variety of stake holders within your county; Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Soil Conservation District (SCD), Farm Services Agency (FSA), County Extension, ND Game and Fish, Fish & Wildlife Service (FWS), Farm Groups, etc. LLC Meetings should be held, at a minimum, once every five years. For additional information on the LLC Process, please see 440-CPM (Conservation Program Manual), Part 500.

A Local Work Group (LWG) is a group made up of representatives with expertise in natural resources who advise NRCS on decisions related to implementation of USDA conservation programs. This group is typically made up of your local FSA, SCD, Tribal Government, and County Extension. This is a smaller, more focused group that takes the broad resource concerns identified in the LLC process and breaks it down into a more refined resource objective. These objectives are then incorporated into NRCS conservation efforts. LWG Meetings will be held annually. For additional information on LWG, please see 440-CPM (Conservation Program Manual), Part 501 and the enclosed LWG Resource Guide.

Your individual LWG should meet to identify 5 ranking questions for cropland and 5 ranking questions for grassland to address one or more resource concerns in your county. Your LWG will also prioritize all 18 Resource Concern Categories in your County for cropland and grassland. Record your LWG decisions on the enclosure LWG Resource Concern Category Prioritization spreadsheet.

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Your CDU should then meet to agree upon a consolidated list of ranking questions and prioritize the resource concerns.

The CDU Supervisors in each Programmatic Zone will then meet to select the desired ranking questions for Cropland and Grassland for each LWG Programmatic Zone and finalize the list of prioritized resource concerns. Please allocate points for each ranking question based on local priorities and resource concerns (the total for each set of questions shall be no greater than 200 points). Creating questions with varying points will allow for more separation in applicants when it comes to ranking. For further guidance on application ranking criteria, see Part 530.404 C of the CPM and the enclosed excerpt from National Instruction 440-310 with example questions. If a facilitator is needed for meetings, please make a request through the proper channels.

Submit the final list of questions (with delegated points) and prioritized resource concern spreadsheet to your respective ASTC - FO and Lori Bloom at lori.bloom@usda.gov by July 1, 2023.

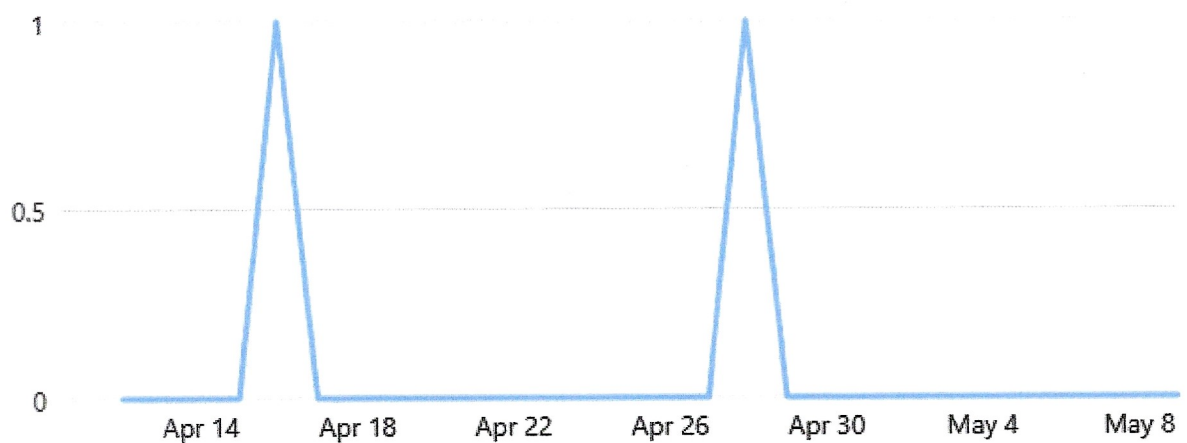
